Ideas For Families:

Parents have recently been chatting with me about how crazy things can be at home in the mornings when they are trying to get their kids to school. We have many families who are working so hard to get their kids to school on time, and we really appreciate the efforts being made ©! One suggestion that I always have for parents is to create a "positive" system of getting kids to school. For example, place a piece of paper that is divided into 5 boxes onto your fridge. Every time that your child listens to you, gets ready for school without arguing or stalling ©, and gets to school on time, you can place a happy face on one of the boxes. You can set goals with your child. For example, if they get 3 days in a week, you can visit the dollar store for a prize, or they get to pick a movie to watch, or they get to do



"something" that they really like. When they have easily handled 3 days, you can increase it to 5 days, etc. When you feel that they are easily handling getting to school on time every day, you can plan a family celebration (eg. go swimming together at the Leisure Centre, etc.) The more we work on positives, the easier it might be in the mornings. Just a helpful hint \odot !
