Afternoon Adventures

We have an amazing after-school program that runs on Tuesdays (Grades 2 and 3) and Thursdays (Grades 4 and 5). It is called "Afternoon Adventures"! This year, the volunteers will be working with students from Grades 2 - 5. Unfortunately, there are not enough volunteers to run a Grade 1 program. Afternoon Adventures' volunteers plan fun activities with our students (arts and crafts; science experiments; field trips; snack time; etc.) This program is meant to support some of our families who may not have the financial means or transportation in order to have their child participate in a community sport or activity. If you would like your child to participate in this program, the registration forms have to be in by Friday, September 14th. At that time, if we have more students than spots available, a committee will make the decision as to which children will be able to attend. © There is room for 25 students in each program. You can find registration packages at our school office.

Student Verification Forms (homework for parents)

Your child will be bringing home a document that contains very important information that we need from our families (eg. emergency phone numbers, etc.). Please check everything over very closely. Yes, parents, you have homework too \odot ! We need these forms returned to the school as soon as possible, signed by you. Please make sure that your email is current on the student verification form that is being sent home. We will be emailing you from time-to-time with some important reminders. If your email changes at some time during the year, please contact us at the office and we will update it. Thanks for your support.

Volunteers

If you are planning to volunteer at Bernard for field trips, classroom support, etc., you are legally required to fill in a Criminal Record Form and return it to the RCMP office on Airport Road before you volunteer. It must have Bernard Elementary's name on the top of the form (eq. If you have filled one out for Girl Guides, this does not

count towards volunteer work at Bernard). If you completed one for the school within the last 4 years, you don't need to do a new one. You can get copies of this form at our office. Also, if you volunteer to drive students from our school, every year you must also fill out a Driver's Insurance Form (and you must have \$1,000,000 3rd party liability) before the event occurs. You also need to attach a driver's abstract from ICBC to the driver's form. Before you volunteer, please attend an orientation session with Mrs. Scott. This year, a volunteer orientation will take place on Wednesday, Sept. 12th from 8:30 a.m. - 9:00 a.m.. If you cannot attend this session, there will be a second one on Friday, Sept. 14th from 2:00 - 2:25 p.m. If you are unable to attend



either session, please contact Mrs. Scott directly at <u>deneen_scott@sd33.bc.ca</u> or phone the school to set an appointment.

Booster Seats

A reminder that there are laws that have been in effect since July 1, 2008 for children requiring booster seats. All children *must use booster seats* until their 9th birthday unless they have reached the height of 145 cm (4'9") tall. If your child is attending a fieldtrip where parent drivers will be used, they must bring a booster seat in order to be able to attend.

Bus Evacuation Drills

One of the activities requires students to jump out of the back or side doors of the bus, with assistance, and onto a gym mat. Some of the intermediate students will be selected to act as helpers. If you have any concerns about your child participating in these drills, please contact the school as soon as possible. This activity is part of the District's ongoing bus safety program and your cooperation is appreciated.



Bernard's Safe-School Initiatives

We're sure that many of you know about some changes to our school around student safety. We'd like to highlight what the changes were from the last few years and why we are implementing them ©! Highlights:

- We are asking all visiting parents to please come and check in at the office. If you are volunteering in your child's classroom, we ask that you wear a volunteer badge indicating to students that you are a safe person in our school.
- If you are dropping something off for your child, please just check-in at the office.
- If you are dropping your child off at school in the morning, we ask that you drop them off after 8:10 (supervision begins at that time), unless they are attending the breakfast program at 8:00 \odot . If you'd like to wait with your child for the morning bell, you are welcome to do so, but please give your hugs and goodbyes to them outside because this is where their teachers come to pick them up to begin their day. If you have something important you'd like to let the teacher know about your child for the day, you are welcome to send them an email the day before, call the office, or let them know when they come to pick up their students in the line-up. We are asking that parents not walk your child into the school if you are here on time. (reason: We are trying to teach students to become independent learners...eg. hanging up their own backpacks, and getting organized for the day, even in Kindergarten \odot . The kids always do an amazing job with this.)
- We are asking that students not use the front doors unless they are late for school, or if a parent is picking a child up early, or if they are in need of a bike lock, etc. (reason: our front office is so busy that, at times, it is difficult to monitor people coming in and out of the front doors. We want to have a clear area where we can monitor it a little closer.)
- If you have to pick up your child early from school, please make sure to sign them out at the office. (reason: for safety reasons.)
- We are also asking Grades 1 5 parents to meet their children after school outside of the door that they enter in the mornings, so the children are entering and exiting from the same door. (reason: The back of the school is a much safer place for students to exit our building because of the traffic concerns at the front of our school.) We are working with the students to have a designated meeting spot to meet their parents. If parents are in parking spots, or walking to meet their children, we are asking parents to meet them at the back of the school. If parents are in the drop-off zone (double-parking behind parked vehicles), students are to walk around to the front of the school, and walk safely on the sidewalk areas to meet those parents. Remember, "drop-off zone" means that those parents are to stay in their vehicles. Suggestion: Many of our parents park on the many side streets of our community and walk to meet their children. ©

Please talk to your children about staying safe around the bus and remind them that this is not a play area. Thank you.
