
Mrs. Ens will be returning after Spring Break. Stay tuned for lots of Library events in the month of April.

ZONES OF REGULATION

We recognize that emotional and social development is equally important as acac purposeful in teaching students to be self-aware and teach them strategies to reg interactions. We encourage families to use the same language and approaches at school and home.

What is Zones of Regulation?

Many of life's regular events cause every persons' emotional states to become less regulated; our emotions move into the "yellow" or "red" zones. Zones of Regulation teaches students to become aware of their feelings and emotions and to recognize triggers that cause their emotions to rise.

Students are then taught how to use calming tools or strategies to decrease their emotions to a more normal "green zone" of being calm and focused.

What are Students Taught?

- How to identify their feelings and levels of alertness
- Different regulation tools/strategies to use
- When and how to use the tools/strategies
- Problem solving strategies for positive solutions
- Understanding how their behaviours influence others' thoughts and feelings
